TB Morbidity & Mortality Review

These training events provide unique opportunities to learn about drug resistance, TB/HIV co-infection, substance abuse, adverse drug effects and in-patient treatment options using a case-based format. The TB M&M Review is a traditional educational forum for healthcare professionals practicing in hospital settings. These reviews are required for hospital accreditation, but present unique opportunities to review the care and management of hospitalized patients. These conferences focus on the most complex and challenging cases of patients with tuberculosis who receive their care at A.G. Holley State Hospital. With web-based technology, healthcare professionals working in community public health settings or academic health centers can take advantage of this educational opportunity from anywhere!

Upon completion of this training, participants will be able to:

- Examine the specific issues involved with community-based care and the challenges presented which resulted in the necessity of treatment provided in an inpatient setting.
- Demonstrate, through individual case history, the principles of transmission and pathogenesis of TB.
- Describe the role of laboratory diagnostics and use of x-ray, CT scans and MRI technology in the diagnosis of TB.
- Identify challenges associated with co-morbidities of TB diagnosis and treatment.
- Outline and discuss TB treatment plans, including how effectiveness and duration of treatment are established.
